Previous Minutes

Previous minutes reviewed by Brent, with updates on action points from the previous minutes.

- New route table has been installed on a stand and is available for use. Tethers have been installed on the tools, but the removable guards need somewhere to be safely stored when not in use.
- Thanks Craig has been issuing the DM roster earlier to give more time for DM slots to be swapped around.
- Some DM's are not closing up the Shed correctly at the end of a shift.
 Action: Rod to prepare a checklist
- 4. Patrick suggested having another DM meeting so we can discuss any issues and procedural changes at the Shed. Perhaps a DM BBQ meeting? Steve suggested setting up a What'sApp group for the DMs. (text, phone & video communication via internet). He said this has proven to be a very effective way of communicating & coordinating activities within his Auckland swarm group. Action: tbc

Financial Report

Summary of Garry's financial report. Refer to Appendix A **Account balances**: Cheque \$4,364.94 and Savings \$12,162.96. Total \$16,528

5. Don nominated Garry to formally take up the position of Treasurer. Ellen seconded and the committee voted in favour, motion passed.

Co-ordinators Report

- Steve reported that there has been a lot of interest in January. We currently have 98
 members, with 4 new awaiting payment and 5 to be removed as they have not
 renewed their membership.
- The Council have communication that there will be a number of events held at Eden Park over the next few months, were Gribblehirst Park will be used as overflow bus parking.

We have been busy with a range of community projects.

New Matters Arising

- 6. Brent & Steve receive regular newsletters from the National MenZShed Action: Steve to forward the last and all future newsletters to all members
- 7. Garry has spoken to Council rep about upgrading the existing fluorescent lights to LED. Action: Garry to provide Council with a list and hopefully they will replace them. (Note: replacement of task lighting over the benches/under the overhead racks with LED's is a separate issue)
- 8. TradeMe Sale: Two items have been sold over the last 60 days (Vintage footprint wrench \$5 & small block plane \$10).

Action: Chris to list large items on TradeMe – to be done

Action: Brent - new tools donated by Bosch need to priced, expected to be sold for 50% of new price.

- 9. Large belt sander is out of action. Motor burnt out but also drum bearings need attention. Small sander, with integrated disc sander on other side, presents a safety risk as guarding is inadequate and the operator needs to reach over moving equipment to reach the on/off button. A quote has been received from Carbatec to replace both machines. Large \$2,100 and small \$680 (both prices include a 15% discount). Patrick proposed we proceed with both purchases, Rod seconded and the committee voted in favour, motion passed.
 Action: Brent(?) to order two new sanders from Carbatec
- 10. Ozito battery drills are failing after 5 years of use 3 of 4 are currently dead. Batteries and charger units still ok. These drills where donated by Bunnings Mt Roskill, unfortunately our contact at Bunnings has moved on. Bunnings Grey Lynn owe the Shed for manning a table during their demo evening.

Action: Steve to look back thru emails to find the details for the Bunnings Grey Lynn contact person. Garry to ask for 4-5 replacement Ozito drills (skins only).

11. Neal mentioned that there is several hundred kgs of scrap steel that needs to be removed. e.g., heavy drill base, excess obsolete lathe & mill components – too heavy for us to drop-off & not suitable for repurposing in Ellen's garden.

Action: Neil to contact Simms Scrap Metal and arrange a pickup from the Shed.

- 12. Rod mentioned that he dropped off 6x scrap circular saw blades and 3x old metal files to a local knife maker, Kiwi Blade Knives in Halesowen St, Sandringham. He runs knife making courses, so was very pleased to receive this high-quality metal and will put it thru his forge.
- 13. Don mentioned that the table tennis table has been repaired and is now ready for sale/donation.

Action: Ellen to advertise it on MarketPlace or Neighbourly

- 14. Nikki will be giving a 20 minute presentation on her WomanZShed initiative at the MenZShed, Region1 meeting. David Broadhead is keen to see the WomenZShed initiative roll out nationally. The Council are also very supportive of the WomenZShed concept.
- 15. Garry mentioned that he has invited the Council to visit the Shed. Date tbc. Ellen raised a concern that when the Council visited the Hub, they raised a number of concerns about H&S, which almost result in them being shut down.
 Action: Neil will work with Rod (H&S rep) to review shortcomings in the Shed's existing

H&S system

- 16. Ellen mentioned that the Hub is planning to hold a Market Day on the Sat 4th March and then the 1st Sat of every subsequent month. There will be a strong focus on 'local' locally sourced food & produce, local communities made products. The Bee Club will be present, and Brent will provide demo rides on Mellow Yellow electric bikes.
- 17. Ellen often uses Ken's trailer but doesn't have access to the office to retrieve the trailer number plate. It was agreed that Ellen should be given the pin code to the office door (same code as front door lockbox).
- 18. Next committee meeting to be held 10am, Friday 24th February.
