Update on Matters Arising from Last Meeting Minutes

Tidying up of Engineering workshop continues. Floor is currently being painted

Financial

Garry's financial report
Bank balance is currently \$17,543.10

Shed's contents insurance is due for renewal on 12th December, expected to be approximately \$1,000. The Shed's book value of fixed assets is \$55,000. Garry has spoken to the insurance broker, and it was agreed that \$50,000 was sufficient cover as much of the equipment had originally been donated and if all was lost it is expected that companies such as Bunnings would continue to be generous. Garry proposed that the insured value to be increased from \$30,000 to \$50,000 and Brent seconded. Note there is a large increase in premium if the insured value exceeds \$50,000.

Co-ordinators Report

Steve reported that we currently have 87 paid-up members. Membership age 60% over 65 years.

New Matters Arising

- Brent suggested replacing the fluorescent lights over the benches with LED's. The
 complete fitting would need to be replaced not just the tubes. Brent's wife had
 previously purchased 10 units for \$78 each, heavily discounted. Craig purchased some
 for his work, panels sized 1.2m x 0.6m priced at \$120/unit.
 Action: Brent to assess how many units are needed and get indicative pricing, so that
 Garry can apply to Council for funding.
- 2. New router table, including new router machine, has been ordered. Due in mid-November. Cost \$1,700. The new system is expected to give much better results and safer operation. It has an adjustable fence with 9cm travel, a kick switch, better accessibility for bit changes and a safety inter-lock switch. Wheels will need to be fitted.
- 3. Brent proposed that the Shed will be officially closed for the Christmas Break, last day Wednesday 21st December and reopen on Wednesday 9th January. In previous years Don has unofficially opened the Shed during this period, no DM's rostered for the shut period.
- 4. Suggested changes to the time and day that committee meetings are held. From last Monday at 6:30pm to last Friday of the Month at 10am. This suited most people present but Craig to confirm that he can work from home that day. Tentatively next meeting 10am Friday 27th January.
- 5. Committee members Andy and Burt don't attend the meetings. Remove them from the list?

Action: Brent to check with Andy.

- 6. Shed promotional pamphlets currently have the annual membership cost printed on them, but the amount is out of date. The cost will need to be crossed out on the large number of pages we currently have. It was suggested that this cost be removed from future pamphlets, people can refer to the Shed website for the current cost.
- 7. Shed apparel: Richard expressed an interest in getting hats made. Not a lot of interest from the committee. **Action:** Brent to ask Richard to provide a template and get some costing.

8. Duty Managers

It was reported that the Wednesday evening DM has failed to turn up a few times, no advanced notice given. 4-6 people typically turn up in the evening.

Action: Nicky needs to update the DM roster website

Action: Craig to issue the roster on the 20th of each month to give DM's a little more advanced notice and more time to arrange swaps.

9. Friday night there was a break-in at the Bike container. They gained entry through the roller door, bikes and equipment were stolen.

Garry had video footage of Shed's steel being taken at 2am. Someone also seen trying to force the doors to the Shed.

Ellen mentioned that she had noticed that the fluorescent lights near the front windows is frequently left on, illuminating the interior of the Shed and potentially enticing unwanted visitors.

Action: Install a 7-day timer on the power supply to these lights to ensure they can't be accidentally left turned on.
